OEO's legislative mission is to reduce opportunity gaps. Our strategic plan priorities concentrate on education justice, especially for communities most affected by COVID-19. We are focusing our limited conflict resolution resources, such as informal mediation and coaching, on <u>K-12</u> students who are:

- Involved with the juvenile justice or juvenile rehabilitation systems
- Out of school, including students with disabilities receiving partial school days
- Experiencing homelessness
- People of color, Black, or indigenous
- In kinship or foster care
- Immigrant, refugee, asylee, or migrant, or students or families whose primary language(s) is not English, or
- Receiving Wraparound with Intensive Services (WISe) or Children's Long Term Inpatient Programs (CLIP) supports
